Group dynamics also deals with the attitude and behavioural patterns of a group. It focuses on how groups are formed, what their structure and processes are in functioning. Therefore, group dynamics is concerned with the interactions and forces operating between groups. Group dynamics is relevant to groups of all kinds – both formal and informal.

Group dynamics is defined as individuals connected with each other with social relations network, and members are in social interaction. Members work together to reach a common goal and are aware of other individuals belonging to the group. A group is coordinating its functions to reach the common goals.

Factors Affecting Group Dynamics

Effective leadership is critical factor in group dynamics. Leaders can influence the direction and goals of a group, as well as the behaviour of individual members. According to Northouse (2018), effective leaders are able to provide a clear vision for the group, establish clear goals and objectives, motivate group members and facilitate effective communication and decision-making.

Effective communication is crucial for group dynamics. It enables group members to share information, articulate their needs and concerns and work together to achieve common goals. According to DeVito (2015), effective communication involves

the ability to listen actively, express oneself clearly and provide feedback that is both constructive and supportive.

Group cohesion refers t the degree to which group members feel a sense of connectedness and belonging to the group. Carron, Brawley and Widmeyer (2002), opined that group cohesion can affect group dynamics by influencing the level of cooperation and collaboration among group members, as well as their motivation and commitment to achieving common goals.

Group diversity refers to the differences in terms of race, ethnicity, gender, age and other characteristics among group members. Diversity can affect group dynamics by influencing the level of conflict and disagreement among group members, as well as the level of creativity and innovation in problem-solving. According to Cox (2014), effective management of diversity involves creating an inclusive environment that values and respects the differences among group members.

Power dynamics refer to the distribution of power and authority among group members. French, Raven and Cartwright (2008), opined that power dynamics can affect group dynamics by influencing the level of cooperation and collaboration among group members, as well as the level of conflict and completion. Effective management of power dynamics involves ensuring that power is distributed fairly and equitably among group members. These factors can have a significant impact on group dynamics and should be carefully considered when working with groups to achieve common goals.

The Role of Leadership in Group Dynamics

Leaders play a critical role in providing direction to a group. They are responsible for setting clear goals and objectives, establishing a shared vision for the group and developing a plan of action to achieve these goals. According to Northouse, (2018), effective leaders are

able to provide a clear sense of direction for the group, which can help to guide the behaviour of individual members.

Bandura, (1997), opined that effective leaders are able to provide positive reinforcement and feedback to group members, which can help to increase their motivation and commitment to the group. Leaders also facilitate effective communication which is very crucial for group dynamics among group members. According to DeVito, (2015), effective leaders are able to listen actively, express themselves clearly and provide feedback that is both constructive and supportive. Leaders are responsible for making decisions on behalf of the group. Effective leaders are able to make decisions that are well-informed, timely and based on a thorough analysis of the available information.

Managing conflict: Conflict is an inevitable part of group dynamics and effective leaders are able to manage conflict in a way that promotes positive outcomes for the group. According to Johnson and Johnson (2014), effective conflict management involves identifying the sources of conflict, developing a plan of action to address these sources and facilitate communication and negotiation among group members.

These roles of leadership are critical for promoting effective group dynamics and should be carefully considered when working with groups to achieve common goals.

Communication

Communication is a critical factor in group dynamics. Effective communication enables group members to share information, articulate their needs and concerns and work together to achieve common goals. According to Tuckman and Jensen (1977), effective communication is crucial during the storming stage of group development when conflict and disagreements

are likely to arise. DeVito (2015), emphasizes the importance of effective interpersonal communication in group dynamics, which includes verbal and nonverbal communication, listening skills and feedback.

- Bales (1950).identified two types of communication behaviours in small groups: taskoriented behaviours and socio-emotional behaviours, Task-oriented behaviours focus on achieving the group's objectives, while socioemotional behaviours focus on maintaining social relationships within the group. communication in group dynamics involves being aware of these different types of communication working behaviours and to promote understanding and collaboration among group members.
- Watzlawick, Beavin and Jackson (2011), emphasize the importance of context and underlying assumptions in communication. Effective communication in group dynamics involves being aware of these underlying assumption and beliefs and working to promote understanding and collaboration among group members. Effective leaders are able to facilitate effective communication by listening actively, expressing themselves clearly and providing feedback that is both constructive and supportive DeVito (2015).

Conflict Resolution

Conflict resolution is an important aspect of group dynamics, as it helps to promote effective communication, build trust and foster cooperation among group members. Conflict can arise in any group setting, and effective conflict resolution strategies are essential for maintaining positive relationships and achieving group goals.

- According to Robbins and Judge (2021), effective conflict resolution strategies involves identifying

- the source of the conflict, understanding the perspectives of all parties involved and developing solutions that meet the needs of all parties. Effective communication is also critical for resolving conflicts in group settings, as it helps to ensure that all parties are heard and that misunderstandings are minimized.
- Other scholars have emphasized the importance of trust and cooperation in conflict resolution. To De Deu and Gelfand (2008), trust is a key component of effective conflict resolution, as it helps to build positive relationships among group members and promote cooperation. Similarly, Tjosvold (2012), emphasizes the importance of cooperation in conflict resolution, as it helps to create win-win solutions that meet the needs of all parties.
